#### **Administrative Rule Statement**

Requirements for statewide degrees are outlined in the Oregon Administrative Rules and further defined by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) through the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development (CCWD) in their Community College Handbook. CGCC follows the current version of the handbook in establishing degree requirements, advising students and conferring degrees.

This administrative rule applies to the following statewide transfer and general degrees: AAOT, ASOT-BUS, ASOT-CS, AS, and AGS.

- 1. <u>AAOT</u>: Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer
- 2. <u>ASOT-BUS</u>: Associate of Science Oregon Transfer Business
- 3. <u>ASOT-CS</u>: Associate of Science Oregon Transfer Computer Science
- 4. *AS*: Associate of Science
- 5. AGS: Associate of General Studies
