2020-21 Nursing Admissions Packet

Thank you for your interest in the Columbia Gorge Community College (CGCC) nursing program.

CGCC's Nursing program has joined with other community college programs and all campuses of Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) in a unified approach to nursing education. This collation of statewide nursing educators and programs is known as the Oregon Consortium for Nursing Education (OCNE). OCNE schools have comparable prerequisites and application processes for students. Acceptance to the program allows for co-admission to CGCC and OHSU nursing programs. The program is designed to provide students the option of completing an Associate's degree from CGCC and/or a bachelor's degree in nursing from OHSU. As such, the course work is outlined in a "four-year" framework:

- Year One:** Prerequisite coursework
- Year Two:** First year OCNE curriculum- CGCC
- Year Three:** Second year OCNE curriculum- CGCC students may earn an AAS degree and be eligible to take the NCLEX RN licensure test.
- Year Four:** Upper division nursing coursework through OHSU with upper division arts, letters and sciences from an accredited university. At the end of this year, students will earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree.

Students who have successfully completed NRS 110 and subsequently fail or withdraw from a course later in the program are not eligible to apply for admission to NRS 110 as that course has already been completed. These students must submit a Nursing Program Re-Entry application.

Admission Requirements

Applicants to the Nursing program must meet the following requirements:

- Completion of prerequisite and pre-program coursework. Students must complete 30 credits of the minimum 45-credit pre-program (prerequisite courses with a letter grade of "C" or better and a prerequisite/pre-pre-program course cumulative GPA of 3.00). These credits must be completed prior to the application deadline and must include Intermediate Algebra and Human Anatomy & Physiology I.
- Submission of official (unopened) college transcripts for all courses to be considered in the awarding of points demonstrating a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or greater. Only pre-program and pre-requisite coursework will be included in the GPA calculation. A transcript for all classes taken at CGCC will be produced by Student Services and placed in your application packet; however, you must indicate CGCC on the application form as one of the colleges attended. If you are a CGCC student and have taken classes at Portland Community College (PCC) since fall 2013, you must request an official transcript from PCC.
- Completion of all required forms, including an online CGCC Admissions form. A checklist of required documents is provided as part of the application packet.

Note: It is very important to meet with an advisor in planning for application to the program to ensure all requirements are completed by the application deadline. Schedule an advising appointment by calling Student Services in The Dalles at 541-506-6011 or Hood River at 541-308-8211

Required Prerequisites

All program prerequisites must be completed with a letter grade of “C” or better to be considered in the application process. The required prerequisites must be completed within the seven years prior to the application deadline, and no later than the end of fall term 2019. For repeated courses, the most recent grade will be used.

- **BI 231 Anatomy and Physiology, 4 credits (BI 231 prerequisite: BI 112 or BI 211)** – BI 231 must be completed with a grade of “C” or better within the 7 years prior to the application deadline and no later than fall term 2019. The entire sequence of anatomy and physiology is required for the nursing program.
- **MTH 95 Intermediate Algebra, 4 credits** – Completion of MTH 95 or a higher level math course for which MTH 95 is a prerequisite with a grade of “C” or better within the 7 years prior to the application deadline and no later than fall term 2017. If the math prerequisite course was taken prior to winter 2013, the applicant must place into MTH 111 on a placement test. Placement test results must be submitted with the application packet and must not be older than 2 years (fall term 2017). CGCC accepts COMPASS, ASSET and ACUPLACER placement results. Mth98 & MTH105 will not meet the prerequisite.

Pre-program Requirements

All pre-program requirements must be completed with a letter grade of “C” or better and taken no later than spring 2020. At least 30 of the pre-program credits must be completed (including above prerequisites) by application deadline. Points are only calculated for credits completed at time of application deadline. BI232, 233, 234 must be completed within seven years of application deadline in order to count for points. After that, they must be completed by the end of spring term 2020 in order to be considered. - **MTH 95 or higher (MTH98 or MTH105 does not count) 4 credits**

Pre-program Coursework (optional for point totals or required to complete degree)

The following coursework may be completed for points and/or required for the degree but are optional pre-program requirements. **These courses are not applied to prereq GPA calculation.**

- **WR227 Technical Writing, 3-4 credits** (This course is a degree requirement.)
- **MP111, Medical Terminology, 4 credits, grade of “B” or better**
- **Additional general education requirements as needed to complete the 45-credit minimum.**

Basic Computer Literacy

The CGCC Nursing program does not require a computer science prerequisite, however, success in a nursing program requires that students be computer literate, including at least word processing, use of spreadsheets and web searches. Students with no computer experience should discuss with an advisor, ways to remediate this competency prior to entering the nursing program.

Application and Admission Process

- Applicants will submit a complete application packet including official transcripts through fall 2019, all required forms and a \$50.00 non-refundable Nursing application-processing fee to the Student Services Office by the **application deadline of 5: 00 p.m., February 17, 2020.**
Official transcripts with prerequisites and pre-program coursework taken fall term 2018 must be received at CGCC by application deadline to count towards the 30-credit requirement. Official transcripts recording winter and/or spring 2020 grades to meet the 45-credit requirement and pre-requisite completion requirement must be received by July 7, 2020.
 - After the application deadline, admissions staff will evaluate each application for completeness and eligibility.
 - All applicants will be assigned a secured CGCC email account. A letter will be sent to your physical address providing you with directions to access this account for future correspondence.
 - Applications will be evaluated according to the point system below.
 - The top 70 scoring applicants will be invited to schedule a proctored essay and take an HSRT exam.
 - Up to thirty (30) students will be accepted. A maximum of thirty (30) alternates will also be chosen. In case of a tie when scoring is completed, preference will first be given to veterans or spouse of a veteran. If there is still a tie, CGCC district residents will receive preference, followed by residents of Klickitat County, Washington, prerequisite GPA, and lottery.
 - Three points for residency will be awarded to the following:
 1. Applicants who reside in Gilliam, Hood River, Sherman, Wasco or Wheeler counties in Oregon and Klickitat or Skamania counties in Washington.
 2. Out of district residents who have completed 30 credits or more at CGCC including prerequisite courses and other supporting coursework.
- NOTE:** Applicants must reside in the above-mentioned counties for ninety (90) days PRIOR TO APPLICATION as verified by the required Declaration of Residency and supporting documentation (see page 11).

Upon Acceptance

Notification of final admissions status will be mailed to each applicant no later than May 20, 2020. Upon notification of admission or waitlist, students must indicate in writing by the stated deadline their intention to enroll, or their position will be given to the next person on the waitlist. Students accepted into the CGCC Nursing Program for fall 2020 will be required to pay a **\$100 non-refundable deposit**, submit proof of payment along with their acceptance form and proof of having had, at a minimum, the first Hepatitis B immunization of the series (at any time in the past) by Monday, June 15, 2020 to hold their place in the program. This deposit will be applied toward fall 2020 tuition.

Following is a list of key things that will be required by the Nursing Department after acceptance into the program:

- All forms, requirements (including immunizations*) and further information will be provided during a mandatory meeting, July 22, 2020, 10am-12noon OR September 18, 2020, 8:30am-4:30pm, for all accepted students and waitlisted students.

Admissions Point System

The following are awarded points in the application process to the Nursing program. It is strongly advised that students preparing for application complete as many of the supporting courses as possible. This will benefit applicants in two ways: it allows students to receive points in the application process for the completed courses and reduces the amount of credits taken each term while in the program. For repeated courses, the most recent grade will be used.

Eligible applicants will be assessed according to the following point system:

Nursing Program Application Checklist

Applications must be turned in no later than 5 p.m. on February 17, 2020. **Partially completed packets will not be accepted by the CGCC Student Services Office.**

Each year is a new process. All required documents must be submitted with the exception of official transcripts already on file.

A complete Nursing Application Packet consists of the following **required** items:

- CGCC Admissions Form for **NEW** CGCC students. Must be completed online at www.cgcc.edu/admissions.
- Nursing Program Application and application checklist
- Declaration of Residency and supporting evidence
- \$50.00 non-refundable application fee. Attach receipt or check to application packet.
- One-year Prerequisite and Pre-Program Course Planning Sheet
- Official** test scores and unopened transcripts from all accredited colleges or universities that contain courses required by the nursing program must be on file at CGCC by the application deadline. A transcript for all classes taken at CGCC will be produced by Student Services and placed in your application packet; however, you must indicate CGCC on the application form as one of the colleges attended. If you are a CGCC student and have taken classes at Portland Community College (PCC) prior to fall 2013, you must request an official transcript from PCC.

The following required prerequisite classes must have been completed with a “C” grade or higher within the 7 years prior to the application deadline and no later than fall term 2019:

- BI 231**
- MTH 95 or higher***

*NOTE: If your Math 95 was taken prior to winter 2013, you must take the Accuplacer placement test and place into **Math 111**. Test scores must be submitted with your application.

- Accuplacer Test: Submit test results if Math 95 was taken prior to winter 2013.

Nursing Program Prerequisite Time-Frame Waiver Request

Submit this form to request a time-frame waiver if it has been longer than seven years since the following program prerequisites were taken:

- **BI 231 Anatomy and Physiology I, BI232 Anatomy and Physiology II, BI233 Anatomy and Physiology III or BI234 Microbiology:** requires a Bachelor’s degree or higher in a biological science.

The following documents must be submitted with this form:

- **Official transcript indicating course completion and/or degree or CLEP test scores showing current competency.**
- **Letter stating why a time-frame extension request would be appropriate including information on how the principles of these classes have been applied in recent work experience.**

All time-frame extension requests will be evaluated by the Nursing Admissions Committee on an individual basis. You will be notified by mail within 30 days from receipt of request form and documentation. Extensions are only valid for the school year in which submitted.
