Columbia Gorge Community College is entering an exciting period of campus renewal—and our commitment is to invest in modern, safe, and welcoming facilities that benefit students and the wider community.

CGCC recently celebrated the opening of its state-of-the-art Nursing Simulation Lab, fundamentally transforming how nursing students gain essential clinical skills before entering busy healthcare environments. In the simulation lab, students work with high fidelity robotic “patients”, programmed to display a vast array of symptoms and health conditions, from everyday complaints to complex emergencies. This hands-on training means students can repeatedly practice assessments, interventions, and decision-making without having to first secure supervised clinical hours in busy hospitals. Instead, learners gain confidence and competence through realistic scenarios, safely making mistakes, receiving immediate feedback, and learning to respond to unpredictable patient needs—all in a supportive, controlled setting.

By bridging the gap between classroom theory and clinical practice, CGCC's simulation lab is helping prepare a new generation of nurses for the realities of modern patient care.

And behind the scenes, our planning and facilities teams are working diligently to map out major campus safety upgrades and a few new projects, ensuring each improvement supports learning goals and community needs. This careful advance work helps campus projects run smoothly, finish on schedule, and deliver lasting value across the Gorge.

Our promise is to invest wisely and efficiently in facilities that support students today and in the future—improvements that reflect our broader mission to help drive inclusive prosperity throughout the region.

American Heart Association Instructor Recertification - BLS*

Completion of this course will renew certification as a BLS Instructor through the American Heart Association (AHA). Lab fee includes renewal of CGCC TC affiliation fee.

This course is completed in classroom sessions with other instructors to discuss teaching methodology, current science and changes, paperwork, and demonstrate your ability to perform CPR and use the AED correctly and effectively. Each instructor will be monitored in the second half of the class, teaching part of an actual CPR class. The American Heart Association BLS Instructor is authorized to teach both the Heartsaver community level provider classes and the BLS for Healthcare Providers CPR courses.

Prior to enrolling in the BLS Instructor course, you must have the following:

- » Current AHA BLS for Healthcare Provider CPR card
- » IF you intend to teach Heartsaver in addition to BLS—you must also have a current AHA Heartsaver First Aid CPR card
- » A current AHA BLS Instructor card
- » Have completed any required AHA updates or training in the current certification cycle.

COMING SOON: AEMT/EMT-I

Advance your emergency medical career while deepening your skills in patient care. The Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT) and EMT-Intermediate (EMT-I) course bridges the gap between EMT training and paramedic-level expertise. Through classroom instruction, clinical rotations, and an ambulance ride-along, you'll gain hands-on experience in IV therapy, medication administration, and cardiac care—preparing you to serve with greater capability and confidence.

This class, along with its coursework and practical training, allows you to sit for the National AEMT testing and certification as well as Oregon's AEMT Certification. The EMT-I component of the course allows you to sit for the Oregon specific EMT-Intermediate testing and certification.

Designed for currently licensed EMTs, the program blends real-world training with classroom learning to help you take the next step in your EMS career.

This course fulfills the State of Oregon Child Care licensing requirement. The online portion must be completed before the in-person session.

Blended learning combines an online component followed by a hands-on session.

The Heartsaver First Aid Course educates rescuers on recognizing and treating adult emergencies until medical personnel arrive. It offers comprehensive training in first aid, adult/infant CPR, and AED.

Face-to-face (in-person)

HX

A "HyFlex" course may be accessed entirely online, face to face, or via Zoom. Students may move between these three delivery methods at-will, from class to class throughout the term. Instructors delivering a HyFlex course present all in-person content in a CGCC classroom. HyFlex instructors may require some direct contact with students in the form of check-ins or office hours. A \$20 fee is required.

LAB

Some classes include a required lab section and fee. Lab sections may have a different time, day, and location from the lecture portion of the class.

O

Online courses are offered entirely online. A \$20 fee is required. Students must log in by the first day of the term and show activity by the first Wednesday, or they may be dropped by the instructor as a no-show.

HYB

Hybrid courses combine face-to-face or Zoom teaching with online teaching activities. Hybrid classes at CGCC take advantage of the best features of both online and face-to-face teaching. By integrating online and face-to-face learning, CGCC faculty complement, reinforce, and expand on the student experience by allowing for a portion of the course to be online, and completed in a self-paced manner by the students while they are still able to benefit from an in-classroom experience. 

FORGED FOR THE FUTURE

CGCC's Metallica Scholars Initiative Amplifies Career Training

At Columbia Gorge Community College, career and technical education is an investment in skill, precision, and persistence. Programs like Aviation Maintenance, Advanced Manufacturing, Construction Technology, and Electro-Mechanical Technology prepare students for essential jobs—but they also require significant resources. From welding gas and fabrication materials to sets of professional-grade tools, the cost of training can be a hurdle for many students.

Enter the **Metallica Scholars Initiative (MSI)**, a partnership in its sixth year between CGCC and the legendary band's All Within My Hands Foundation. The foundation was created to promote sustainable communities through workforce education, and it has become one of the most influential champions of skilled trades in North America. Being named a Metallica Scholar community college means more than funding; it affirms a shared commitment to hands-on instruction, workforce readiness, and community building.

Each year, the program provides funding that equips CGCC students with their own sets of tools, safety gear, and technical equipment—delivered during the first weeks of class. These essential supplies aren't borrowed from the college; they belong to the students. Having the tools in hand early helps them participate fully in labs, practice outside of class, and transition more easily into jobs after graduation.

CGCC is one of only a few Oregon colleges chosen for the Metallica Scholars program. College representatives from each Metallica college (there are now MSI programs in all fifty states and Guam) attend annual training sessions with peers nationwide to learn how other colleges are evolving these scholarships and multiplying the impact through community partnerships. Because the foundation tapers its financial support each year, participating colleges are encouraged to “braid” additional local funding to sustain the program's momentum.



At CGCC, The Roundhouse Foundation has stepped up to keep that rhythm strong. The Roundhouse support adds stability and longevity to this unique benefit to students, extending its reach to more students each year. Together, the Metallica and Roundhouse partnership has contributed more than \$300,000 to date, directly supporting around 50 CGCC students each Fall as they prepare for high-demand jobs across

aviation, construction, and manufacturing industries. For these students, the tools they receive are more than a scholarship—they're an invitation to build, create, and launch the next stage of their careers right here in the Gorge.



CGCC is preparing to open its new Industrial Training and Assessment Center (ITAC) on February 20th, a hands-on lab that expands the college's capacity to train students and local workers on advanced manufacturing and clean-energy technologies. Located on The Dalles Campus inside the Columbia Gorge Regional Skills Center, ITAC joins CGCC's Advanced Manufacturing & Fabrication labs, which already house welding, 3D printing, CNC milling, and metrology equipment.

In this modern, industry-aligned space, learners will work directly with cutting-edge tools and training systems that mirror what they'll see in regional manufacturing shops—from laser cutters and CNC machines to additive manufacturing and precision measurement tools. This practical experience lets students and incumbent workers practice set-ups, troubleshooting, and prototyping in a controlled environment, building confidence, problem-solving skills, and the teamwork local employers need. By bridging the gap between theory and real-world technical environments, CGCC's ITAC lab is preparing a new generation of technicians and fabricators for high-demand jobs across the Gorge and beyond.

Our promise is to invest wisely and efficiently in facilities that support students today and in the future—improvements that reflect our broader mission to help drive inclusive prosperity throughout the Columbia Gorge.

Start Here, Go Anywhere

How Guided Pathways helps CGCC students move from the Gorge to university and great careers.

What do you mean by
“Guided Pathways?”

Guided Pathways is a whole-college approach where programs are grouped into clear “paths,” and students get built-in advising and support so they can choose a goal, take the right classes, and finish on time with fewer surprises.

Community colleges like CGCC use Guided Pathways to help students see a clear route from “I think I might want to go to college” to “I’m ready for the university or to launch my career.” In a rural region like ours, that clarity can be the difference between dreaming about a degree or industry credential and actually earning one.

Guided Pathways start with a simple idea: organize programs into “paths,” then surround students with support so they don’t have to figure everything out alone. We recognize that our students juggle jobs, family, and long drives. We design college around those realities. Faculty and advisors help students choose a pathway that fits their goals, then check in regularly to adjust the plan as life changes. Our smaller class sizes mean more one-on-one attention in class, where students strengthen writing, critical thinking, and communication skills that universities and future employers expect. Instead of guessing which classes “might” transfer, students follow a sequence that keeps them on track and helps them avoid extra time and cost.

CGCC is a strategic choice

For students who plan to transfer to a four-year university, Guided Pathways help remove the guesswork that often leads to unexpected surprises and extra semesters, and for students who are looking to dive head first into a career in a skilled trade, those pathways have been shaped by many conversations with business leaders right here in the Gorge. Faculty and staff work with regional employers to identify the specific skills and credentials that lead to real jobs, then build those expectations into the classes. In both directions—university transfer or career and technical education—students see how each class connects to their larger goal instead of signing up one term at a time and hoping it all fits together in the end.

The result is a more intentional college experience. Whether a student is writing their first research paper or learning to operate cutting-edge equipment, they are moving along a roadmap that has been thoughtfully designed and regularly updated. That looks like small, discussion-based courses that build confidence, alongside hands-on labs where students practice the technical skills local employers are asking for.

Most importantly, Guided Pathways keep the focus on students’ long-term lives, not just their next term. Some will transfer to universities in Corvallis, Eugene, or beyond, while others will stay in the Gorge and go straight to work in health care, construction, manufacturing, or other high-demand fields. Both choices strengthen our rural communities. By connecting university-bound and trades-bound students under one framework, CGCC aims to ensure that our students start with a clear path forward.


