

5010 - Admissions and Concurrent Enrollment

The College shall admit students who meet one of the following requirements:

- Students 18 years of age or older who can benefit from instructional programs offered are eligible to enroll in any course for which they meet prerequisites.
- Students under 18 years of age must provide a signed Release from Compulsory Attendance from the Educational Service District or proof of graduation from their resident high school unless they are taking courses through an articulation agreement with their school district or other program.
- Students 17 years of age who have satisfactorily completed a secondary school curriculum or who hold a GED are eligible to enroll.
- Students under 16 years of age who are not as part of an articulated agreement or have not graduated from high school and wish to enroll in credit classes will be required to follow an under 16 admissions process.
- High School students will be allowed to enroll in concurrent enrollment courses via the College's College Now program.
