#### RECOMMENDATION:

Receive and file the March Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2015-16.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The March Financial Report includes nine (9) months of financial data through seventy-five (75) percent of the fiscal year. The year-end estimates-to-close are based on historical financial patterns and anticipated future expenditures.

Expectations of both revenue and expenditures were revised down slightly with the addition of the March financial data. There was no significant change to bottom-line estimates of the yearend surplus or deficit. Financial data through March includes the entirety of regular registration. Final tuition numbers will only settle downwards as a small number of students typically withdraw in the first several weeks of the term. This typical pattern of withdraws is factored into the current estimates-to-close.

The attached estimate-to-close calculates a \$2.1 Million Beginning General Fund Balance for the 2016-17 Fiscal Year. This Beginning Balance figure will be incorporated into the available resource assumption of the 2016-17 Proposed Budget.

Looking forward to next year's enrollment, the Oregon Employment Department released a March report on economic indicators in the Columbia Gorge (attached). Consistent with existing trends, the unemployment rate continues to fall both in our region and state-wide. More concerning is the results of the 2015 Job Vacancy Survey which showed that eight out of ten jobs in the Central Oregon/East Cascades region did not require education beyond high school. This economic report combined with the potentially positive enrollment impacts of the Oregon Promise grant program makes forecasting enrollment highly uncertain.




## **Local Area Unemployment Rates**

Seasonally Adjusted




### **Monthly Unemployment Rates**



## Eight out of 10 Vacancies Do Not Require Education Beyond High School.

According to the 2015 Job Vacancy Survey, there were approximately 4,911 vacancies in the Central Oregon/East Cascades region. The survey included 1,300 private employers with two or more employees.

Eight out of 10 jobs in the region did not require education beyond high school. The average hourly wage for jobs with no education requirement was \$11.14 and the hourly wage for jobs that required a high school degree was \$13.27.
