Columbia Gorge Community College is moving from vision to visible change, with bond-funded projects rolling out across the college over the next few months. Together, these upgrades will modernize critical systems, improve safety and accessibility, and create more welcoming spaces for learning and community use.

This summer, visitors will see work begin on several high-impact projects. New signage will be installed across campus in The Dalles, giving students and guests clearer wayfinding in both English and Spanish and better reflecting the diversity of the Gorge. At the same time, maintenance and safety work begins on parking areas in both Hood River and The Dalles, including lot repairs and a new parking area for Building 5. Also, the addition of new footpaths will make it easier and safer for all students and community members to move between classrooms and services.

CGCC is also investing heavily in campus safety and security. This summer, crews will install new camera systems across campus and upgrade exterior door locks and access controls. These changes will help CGCC respond more quickly in an emergency, improve daily security for evening classes and events, and give students and employees greater peace of mind as they study and work on campus. An elevator replacement for Building 2 is also scheduled, improving accessibility and dependability for people with mobility needs.

Behind the scenes, the bond funding is strengthening the college's core facilities so they remain reliable for decades to come. Beginning in May, roofing projects will add new insulation and improve drainage on multiple buildings, reducing heat and cooling loss through the roof and improving energy efficiency. Starting in summer 2027, major HVAC upgrades in key buildings will replace aging systems with more efficient, better-controlled heating and cooling, improving comfort for students and staff while lowering long-term operating costs.

Finally, the bond supports program growth by making targeted improvements to specialized lab and learning spaces. At the Hood River Center, an expansion of the science lab will give science and healthcare instructors more room for hands-on instruction and safer handling of chemicals and lab materials. Additional improvements to shared community spaces will follow, including upgrades that will help CGCC welcome fans and families as the college launches its new athletics program.

These projects represent more than concrete, steel, and equipment—they are a community-backed investment in student success and regional prosperity.

Thanks to voters' support for the 2024 bond, CGCC is able to move quickly on long-planned improvements that will keep our college safe, accessible, and ready for the next generation of students.



Making books more affordable for every student.

Columbia Gorge Community College is expanding the use of Open Educational Resources (OER)—free (as in actually free) or low-cost (less than \$50 per class) course materials that instructors can adapt, update, and share so students have what they need from the first day of class, without waiting for—or paying for—expensive books. This spring, 116 CGCC classes used low- or no-cost materials to help reduce what students spend on textbooks, and by fall term we'll have even more.

Across Oregon, colleges and universities are teaming up to make textbooks less expensive or even free, and CGCC is part of that effort through Open Oregon Educational Resources. This statewide network helps schools share free and low-cost textbooks, support instructors who want to move away from high-priced books, and track how much money students are saving. An Open Oregon review found that the lowest-cost transfer-degree pathways can reduce course-materials costs by more than 75 percent compared with the statewide average—a glimpse of what no-cost and low-cost schedules can do for students.

When a CGCC class uses “low-cost” or “no-cost” materials, it’s part of a larger movement that’s changing how students get what they need to learn—right here in the Gorge.

HOW DO I GET IN ON THE LOW-/NO-COST ACTION?

When you search CGCC’s online class schedule (cgcc.edu/schedule), look for the “Materials Cost” column in the course listing. That column tells you whether a class uses traditional textbooks or has been designated Low Cost or No Cost for course materials.

No cost = textbooks and materials are free!

Low cost = books and materials cost under \$50.

Once you’ve picked your classes, you can see exactly what your books and materials will cost before the term begins by going to cgcc.slingshotedu.com/buy-books and finding your classes.

Get started with college now

DUAL ENROLLMENT FOR FALL TERM

Dual enrollment is one of the simplest ways to save money on college and help you get ahead while you’re still in high school.

HERE’S HOW TO GET STARTED.

1. Start with your high school counselor

Ask about **College Now**, **Early College**, **Expanded Options**, and **Running Start**. Each dual enrollment program works a little differently depending on your goals, schedule, and where you live (OR or WA).

2. Match the program to your goals

- » Want to earn college credits in your high school classroom? Start with **College Now**.
- » Ready to take classes taught by CGCC? Look at **Expanded Options** or **Running Start**.
- » Need flexibility or a specific course your high school doesn’t offer? **Early College** may fit.

3. Map out a simple plan

Work with your counselor to choose classes that count for both high school graduation and future college credit. Focus on transferable courses whenever possible.

4. Understand the cost savings

Dual enrollment courses are a great savings compared to standard college tuition. Completing even a few classes now can save hundreds—or thousands—later.

5. Prepare for college-level expectations

You’ll get the experience—and responsibility—of taking a college level class. Treat them like true college courses.

6. Stay connected and supported

CGCC and your high school work together to provide advising, instruction, and support close to home. Don’t hesitate to ask questions along the way.

American Heart Association Instructor Recertification - BLS*

Completion of this course will renew certification as a BLS Instructor through the American Heart Association (AHA). Lab fee includes renewal of CGCC TC affiliation fee.

This course is completed in classroom sessions with other instructors to discuss teaching methodology, current science and changes, paperwork, and demonstrate your ability to perform CPR and use the AED correctly and effectively. Each instructor will be monitored in the second half of the class, teaching part of an actual CPR class. The American Heart Association BLS Instructor is authorized to teach both the Heartsaver community level provider classes and the BLS for Healthcare Providers CPR courses.

Prior to enrolling in the BLS Instructor course, you must have the following:

- » Current AHA BLS for Healthcare Provider CPR card
- » IF you intend to teach Heartsaver in addition to BLS—you must also have a current AHA Heartsaver First Aid CPR card

F2F

Face-to-face (in-person)

HX

A "HyFlex" course may be accessed entirely online, face to face, or via Zoom. Students may move between these three delivery methods at-will, from class to class throughout the term. Instructors delivering a HyFlex course present all in-person content in a CGCC classroom. HyFlex instructors may require some direct contact with students in the form of check-ins or office hours. A \$20 fee is required.

LAB

Some classes include a required lab section and fee. Lab sections may have a different time, day, and location from the lecture portion of the class.

O

Online courses are offered entirely online. A \$20 fee is required. Students must log in by the first day of the term and show activity by the first Wednesday, or they may be dropped by the instructor as a no-show.

HYB

Hybrid courses combine face-to-face or Zoom teaching with online teaching activities. Hybrid classes at CGCC take advantage of the best features of both online and face-to-face teaching. By integrating online and face-to-face learning, CGCC faculty complement, reinforce, and expand on the student experience by allowing for a portion of the course to be online, and completed in a self-paced manner by the students while they are still able to benefit from an in-classroom experience. A \$20 fee is required.

Z

Zoom classes are offered entirely over Zoom. There is no fee, but signup with an email address is required. CGCC students should use their CGCC school email to sign up.

ZM

Zoom Optional courses allow students to attend face-to-face courses either in-person or via Zoom.

Did you know?

When adults build reading, math, and English language skills, the whole community benefits.

GED preparation, Adult Basic Education, and ESOL classes help adults qualify for better jobs, increase their earning power, and support a stronger local economy. Research shows that adults who earn a GED or high school-equivalent credential are more likely to earn more over time than those who leave school with no credential. And parents who improve their own skills are also better able to help their children with homework, communicate with teachers, and navigate school and health systems—boosting success for the entire family.

Adult education at CGCC is an investment in our region's future.

GED PREPARATION

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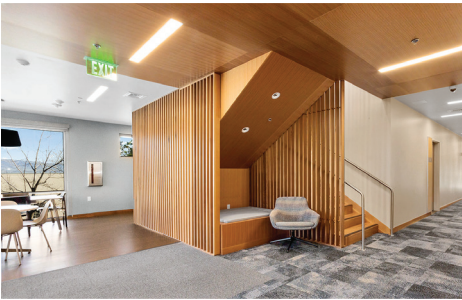
