Outcome #1 Method to assess student understanding *

Students will participate in conversations with partners on some familiar topics. They will fill out a self-assessment on a scale of 1 to 5 to ascertain whether or not they were understood and successful in their speaking efforts.

Outcome #2 Method to assess student understanding *

Students will take formative assessments throughout the term. They will read short stories that deal with personal and familiar topics for readers at this proficiency level. They will answer comprehension questions which will be collected for grading. They will take a final reading test which will serve as the assessment for this outcome with a comprehension goal of 80%.

Outcome #3 Method to assess student understanding *

The students will write a short paragraph about their personal interests and experiences or common events. They will write clear simple and compound sentences mostly in the present tense. Their writing will be graded on a scale of 1 to 5. In order to meet

their goal they need to get a score of 4 or 5.

4. How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? This outcome will be successfully met if 80% of the students who attended 80% of the term get a score of 4 or 5 in their final speaking assessment.

Outcome #1 *

How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? 80% of the students who attended 80% of the term will pass with an 80% or higher in their final reading assessment.

Outcome #2 *

How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? Students who attended 80% of the term will meet this outcome if 80% of them complete all writing assessments with a score of 4 or 5.
