Outcome #1 Method to assess student understanding * Students will give a short presentation on a current event. A speaking rubric will be used to score their presentations. Students will check that they have been understood by their classmates.

Outcome #2 Method to assess student understanding * Students will have numerous listening activities from the text we will be using in class. These texts have listening activities and comprehension checks. Students will monitor their own progress and instructor will informally assess the comprehension activities.

Outcome #3 Method to assess student understanding * Students will read an easy-leveled reader during the class. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the text through comprehension questions.

The instructor will walk around the room during and after listening activities and check the students responses to the listening questions. If the students answer the questions successfully 80% of the time by the end of the term, they will have successfully completed the listening exercises.

Students will write their answers to comprehension questions of a simple story. If the students can answer questions 80% of the time then it will demonstrate that they have successfully completed the reading portion.
