Outcome #2 Method to assess student understanding * In a series of verbal exercises the students will respond to commands, requests, offers, and questions about target content with appropriate actions, answers or verbal conversational responses indicating at least partial comprehension of verbal and culturally significant body language

Outcome #3 Method to assess student understanding * Students will read increasingly difficult pieces of written text demonstrating their knowledge by matching vocabulary, answering comprehension questions, playing games using target vocabulary, and reading short stories aloud with partners smoothly and retelling the simple stories.
