Method of Assessment

Participation in class brainstorming and freewriting exercises that identify potential topics.

Having students identify the pre-writing technique used for the topics of each of their written assignments.

Outcome #1: Method to assess student understanding *

Quiz on identifying four types of pre-writing techniques.

Outcome #2: Method to assess student understanding *

In-class practices identifying and correcting sentence errors.

Peer input on rough drafts to help identify sentence errors before final drafts are finished.

Self-correction of sentence errors before submitting final drafts of written assignments,

Outcome #3: Method to assess student understanding *

Practice writing topic sentences that introduce the topic and add a controlling idea about the topic.

Practice writing concluding sentences that clearly "wrap up" the central idea in a paragraph.

Identifying transitional words and expressions in others writing and their own.

Quizzes on various types of transitional expressions and how they are used.

4. How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome?

As they participate in in-class practices of freewriting, brainstorming, and mapping techniques, I should be able to see their progress in employing and identifying the usefulness of those pre-writing techniques.

Outcome #1: *

Asking students to identify the pre-writing technique used in their written assignments.

Outcome #2: How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? *

Quizzes which ask them to identify sentence errors and correct them in class.

Working with students to self-correct sentence errors in their rough drafts and correct them.

Outcome #3: How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? *

Their written paragraphs (five over the term) should demonstrate increasing sophistication in mastering interesting and attention-getting topic sentences, supportive examples and details in their body sentences, and a definite and holistic concluding sentence.
