The students were given weekly quizzes as well as a final exam. their final exam included a written as well as a practical. They needed to get an 80% on the written and each practical exam was pass-fail. The same standards that the NREMT uses were applied to the practical portion of the exams. I had 6 students begin the term. One did not take the final exams. Of the 5 who tested 3 failed the written and one of those three also failed the practicals. I gave the 2 students who only failed the written an incomplete and an opportunity to retake a different written exam within 2 weeks of the final exam. Total I had one outright failure, two passes, and 3 incompletes. The final exam for the 2 students were 80% and 95% with all practical stations passed. This for the below questions only 3 students may be used.
