3. What contributed to student success and/or lack of success? *

This course has not been offered in a while. This time it is a newly built hybrid course with an OER text. The students had weekly interaction with the instructor, had scenarios specific to that week's disorder themes to analyze and address, plus in-class they had group work and sharing of personal experiences. The Forums came from the text, the reflection papers gave the opportunity for insight, introspection, critical thinking and personal reflection, and the real-life observations gave them the opportunity to relate course learning to analysis and interpretation to actual behaviors.
