3. What contributed to student success and/or lack of success? *

Student were engaged and the content of this course is meaningful to students who are entering the job market or already have job market experience. In this course, all students had real work experience and work sites secured for OS 280F. They also had excellent support from their Work Site Supervisors, which was evident in my communication with them. One student did drop this course in Week 8, which may have been a result of lack of support from their Work Site Supervisor (although OS 280G does not require a work site to complete).

Course is aligned with the course outcomes. The challenge comes in staying current with industry trends and keeping topics engaging and relevant to these trends. Additional work needs to occur to create a roadmap aligned course activities with course outcomes.

Students are still unclear as to the separation between OS 280 F – Work Experience and OS 280 G – Seminar, possibly because both OS 280 F & G are in the same Moodle shell, although the gradebook and specific assignments are labeled with the course in which it is aligned to. Additionally, there are 2 separate syllabi.

CLO #1: Communication. The areas that faculty are focusing on are: "Source and Evidence" and "Organization and Presentation" and

CLO #2: Critical Thinking/Problem Solving. The areas that faculty are focusing on are: "Student's Position" (Critical Thinking) and "Evaluate Potential Solutions" (Problem Solving).

CLO #4: Cultural Awareness. The area that faculty is focusing on is: "Curiosity" – Encouraging our students to "Ask deeper questions about other cultures and seek out answers to these questions"
