4. How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome?

Outcome #1: *

Last term I assessed outcome #1 with assigned annotations. The students were nearly always late turning these in so they lost points. I am hoping the communal discussion will motivate them to prepare their written responses on time this term. Each discussion post is worth points. I'd like to see 80% of my students earn 75% or more of the discussion points possible.

Outcome #2: How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? *

If students are able to produce and turn in rough drafts and revisions. I'd like to see 80% of students score 75% or better on this assignment.

Outcome #3: How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? *

If students regularly turn in their written peer reviews and are able to produce revised pieces that demonstrate thoughtful integration of suggestions. I'd like to see 80% of students score 75% or better on these assignments.
