WINTER REGISTRATION

Registration priority for non-veterans is based on the number of credits successfully completed at CGCC. It does not include courses attempted or graded F, W, I, AU, or NP, transfer credits, or classes currently in progress.

In compliance with House Bill 2565, CGCC offers priority registration to veterans, active or reserve service members, and dependents receiving VA education benefits, in advance of their official registration period each term.

Students may also register on any scheduled registration day or time after their priority day through the first week of the term. After the first week, students must obtain instructor permission to join a class in progress.

Discounts for District Residents, age 65+

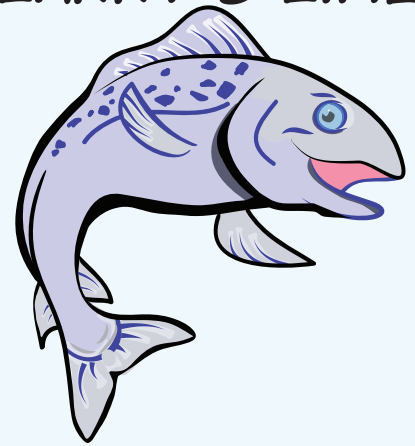

Check the course description for eligibility since some classes may not allow tuition discounts. Discounts do not apply to full classes or to lab and other class fees. You will be notified if the class is full and the tuition discount will not apply. Request your discount at the time of payment or by calling the Business Office.

Oregon Senior Option—applies to credit classes only

Senior Oregon residents are eligible for a program called Oregon Senior Option that allows them to audit classes that are not full while paying no tuition. Students pay associated fees and book costs. For more information, contact Student Services.

Credit Class Payments

Payment for credit classes is due on the first Friday of the term, unless a payment arrangement has been made with the business office. Late fees will be assessed at a rate of 10% of account balance, up to \$75, if paid after the first week of the term.

Community Education Class Payments

Payment for community education/non-credit classes is due at the time of registration.

Drop Dates, Refunds & Removal of Charges

Charges:

Charges are applied to a student's account when the student registers for a class. All of the tuition charges associated with a class will be removed if the student officially drops within the refund period. Some lab fees are non-refundable. No charges will be removed if the student drops after the drop deadline.

Drop Deadlines for Credit Classes:

Credit classes must be dropped online through MyCGCC. If a credit class is not dropped within the drop period, it will result in a "W" grade on the transcript, indicating a withdrawal, and no charges will be refunded.

Students are entitled to a 100% refund, except for non-refundable lab fees, when a course is dropped during the following deadlines:

- 8-11 week classes | drop by the first Friday of the term
- 2-7 week classes | drop by the end of the first day of the class
- classes fewer than 2-weeks | drop before the first day the class meets
- No refunds will be given after the deadline

If you believe an extreme hardship forced you to withdraw after the drop with refund period, or prevented you from dropping within the refund period, and you wish to petition for a removal of charges, see the section titled "Refund Requests After the Drop Period" later in this section.

Drop Deadlines for Non-Credit Classes:

Non-credit/community education classes may be dropped online, in person at Student Services, or over the phone with a Student Services representative.

Students are entitled to a 100% refund, except for non-refundable lab fees, when a non-credit course is dropped prior to the first class meeting.

Refund Requests Within the Drop Period:

The Business Office automatically issues refunds to students who drop within the drop period. The refund process as follows:

- Refunds from tuition and fees are first applied to outstanding charges on the student's account. If the student receives financial aid and opted to charge books on his/her account, this will also be deducted prior to any refund.
- If the credit is the result of a payment by check or cash, a check is issued in the student's name.
- If the credit is the result of a bank card payment, the refund will be applied to the original bank card.
- Refunds resulting from check overpayment are held two weeks from the date of the original payment.

Refund Requests After the Drop Period:

If an extreme hardship prevented you from completing a credit course, and you could not drop during the refund period, you may request to have tuition charges removed from your account. Fees, especially any non-refundable lab fees may not be refunded. A Tuition Appeal form for requesting a refund can be obtained from the Student Services office in The Dalles or Hood River. You will be asked to provide documentation of your circumstances to support your claim. Your petition, and all accompanying documentation, must be received by the filing deadline to be considered. Please see the form for more details.

Inclement Weather/School Closures

Classes are sometimes canceled due to inclement weather or other emergency conditions. Online classes continue regardless of weather closure, unless otherwise stated by instructor. CGCC class cancellation information is announced in the following places:

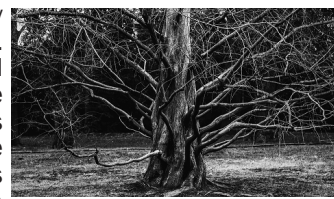

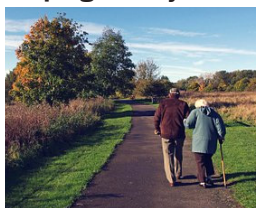

The Million Hearts Project

Everyone has a breaking point. Jenny Loughmiller's came in 2016. "I went through a really difficult time in my life where it felt like all my foundations were crumbling," she says. "I was terribly depressed and didn't feel worthy of being loved or capable of loving. My heart felt like a sieve."

For many people, soul-crushing sadness becomes a mire they can't escape. Loughmiller found a way out through art. "I knew I needed to repair my heart and thought that perhaps by painting one hundred of them for women who had inspired me I could fashion a new one for myself."

Her effort became The Hundred Hearts Project. Loughmiller intended it to be private—a simple series of messages of gratitude from herself to those one hundred women who had touched her life. But next, something extraordinary happened. "As I began to see the transformation that gratitude was bringing to my life I knew I couldn't keep the project to myself." Instead, she shared the concept and her artwork on social media. The response was "overwhelming."

Following her initial model, others started their own Hundred Hearts Projects, using not just paintings, but "notes of thanks, poems, art, cookies, dinners - all sorts of creative ways to thank the people around them. It was incredible to see how deeply the message of gratitude resonated with people."

Loughmiller was born and raised in Anchorage, Alaska. She met her husband while attending University of Idaho. They settled in The Dalles and bought Muirhead Canning Company in 2006. With four children ages 7, 11, 14, and 15, Loughmiller calls working as a full-time mom, artist, and gratitude advocate "a pretty sweet gig."

She minored in art, but never took a painting class until last year. So why

choose an artistic medium to express gratitude? Loughmiller says "I think we all have a need to be understood. I feel things really deeply, but have a difficult time expressing those thoughts in straight-forward language—there just aren't the right words."



She calls the relationship between art and gratitude "a beautiful connection—art speaks where words can't. Whether we think we are an artist or not, our own uniqueness spills out onto the page when we use color and line and pattern and texture to express ourselves. It's a very vulnerable thing to create something with our very own hands that exists outside of our body for other people to see. To couple that intimate creation with gratitude turns that piece of art into a very simple, tender act of connection. It's powerful."

This winter, Loughmiller will teach a one-day Art & Gratitude Workshop at CGCC. "I love leading people to the place where art and gratitude intersect," she says. For her, the relationship between art and gratitude is "deeper than feeling thankful. It's a recognition that right now, in this very moment, life is good. It is the foundation of a deep, unshakable joy."

As her own initial project began to wind down, Loughmiller wanted to find a way to share the idea on an even wider scale. She says she "felt called

to the mission of spreading the power of gratitude." The result is The Million Hearts Project.

"The Hundred Hearts Project is a gratitude project on the personal level," Loughmiller says. "It's about you expressing your gratitude one hundred times to one hundred different people to bring the practice of gratitude into your own life - and touch the hearts of one hundred other people. The Million Hearts Project is a collaborative art and gratitude project where we gather the gratitude of a million different people for a million different people. It's a project that seeks to see the good in the people around us - to help us all realize that a simple thank you is a powerful force for good."

The Million Hearts Project is currently funded by individual donors and participants, and run by "an incredible team of dynamic, professional women who are donating their expertise," Loughmiller says. "Our business model is for the Project to be self-sustaining through participation fees, but we are actively seeking funds to help with our start-up costs. If the idea of rippling art and gratitude around the world speaks you, we welcome your tax-deductable donation. The Million Hearts Project is currently volunteer-led so 100% of monies raised go directly into the current project of building our robust database."

So, once they've gotten a million hearts, what's next for Jenny Loughmiller? "Ha! I'll let you know around 999,999!"

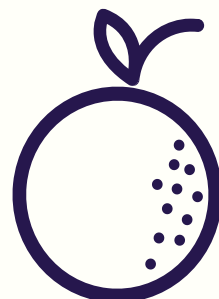
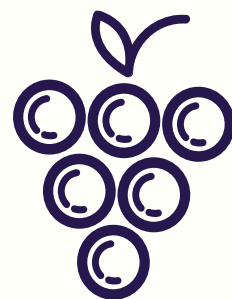
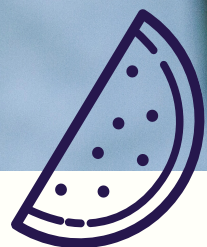
