Fall 2021 Application Packet

Deadline: July 2, 2021

Gorge Scholars is a tuition waiver program available to eligible high school graduates, home school completers, and military veterans who graduated from a school or registered as a home school student within CGCC's service area. Priority will be given to students from Wasco, Hood River, Skamania, Klickitat, Sherman, Wheeler, and Gilliam counties.

Gorge Scholars receive full tuition waivers for up to 18 credits per term. (Books, fees and miscellaneous expenses are **not** included.)

- All Gorge Scholar recipients will be required to participate in the CGCC Gorge Scholars program.
- Initial awards are for the 2021-22 academic year. Eligibility for the year two award is based on the cumulative GPA after spring term of student's first year.

It is important that you read all information in this application packet for the fall 2021 Gorge Scholars program. Applications will be awarded in the order received followed by completed requirements. The packet includes:

Gorge Scholar Application Timeline after submission:

- Acknowledgement letters and intent to enroll forms will go out as applications are received.
- Paper work and test scores must be submitted no later than July 2nd.
- Official acceptance and non-acceptance letters will go out in July.

Application and Receiving Notice of Award

- Apply for admission to CGCC online at www.cgcc.edu/admissions. Your CGCC ID# will be provided during this process.
- Return complete Gorge Scholars application packet to CGCC Student Services in The Dalles or Hood River by Friday, July 2, 2021. Incomplete or late applications will not be accepted.
- Placement testing is available by appointment only. Results must be submitted prior to the July 2nd deadline. To schedule a time to take the placement test, call 541-506-6011, option 2.
- The first round of initial notifications will be sent by the end of April.
- Up to 12 applicants who have submitted applications will be awarded.
- Upon notification of award, students must return the Intent to Enroll form by the stated deadline or their position will be given to an applicant on the waitlist.
- Students must submit the required documents listed in the above table by the stated deadline to keep their spot for fall term awarding.

Upon Acceptance of Award

In order to maintain Gorge Scholar eligibility for up to two years, students must:

- Continuously enroll (fall, winter and spring terms) in at least 12 credits; and
- Maintain a CGCC cumulative GPA of 3.25 or better by the end each academic year; and
- Participate in the CGCC Gorge Scholars program. Gorge Scholars requirements include, but are not limited to: lead campus tours, assist at new student days and other student activities, help the CGCC high school outreach team, and other student engagement needs. This program has a Gorge Scholars advisor who is available throughout your time in the program and there will be a leadership training during the summer. This program is a great way to become involved on campus, meet new people, while helping prospective and new students.

Support Services for Students with Disabilities

Students must provide documentation and request services a minimum of four weeks prior to the beginning of the term to ensure the availability of appropriate and timely services.
