From assignment #1: Reflection on modern artist: Students study and analyze modern artist's work and write a reflection using visual arts language, interpreting cultural styles, symbolism, and content of work. Students became increasingly success at writing essays analyzing artists' works, using visual arts language and thus achieving the outcome. From Assignment #2: Students studied history of block printing, designed and printed their own blocks. Students incorporated their understanding of printmaking history while creating a personal response thus achieving the outcome. From assignment #3: Personal powerpoint art history presentation whereas students researched the social, cultural, economic and political context of their chosen art period and presented their findings to the class enacting the role of teacher and solidifying their understanding and knowledge, thus achieving the outcome. All students successfully completed presentations addressing the outcome.
