Head Start Observation - The student nurse will be able to demonstrate application of the nursing process by her/his ability to Identify health care needs specific to children in a group childcare/preschool setting. Complete a developmental assessment focusing on motor skills, attention spans, verbal ability, types of toys used.

Clinical Performance Evaluation, Clinical Care Plan, and Concept-Based Learning Activities. The student nurse will apply the Clinical Judgment Model to assess a diverse or vulnerable population, including noticing, interpreting, responding and reflecting.
