\* Method of Assessment 3. What methods will be used to assess individual student understanding of each of these outcomes? (Please be specific.) Outcome #1: Method to assess student understanding

Students will complete Summary, Analysis, and Response (SAR) assignments on readings throughout the term. These assignments ask students to examine, analyze, and respond to various types of writing.

## \* Outcome #2: Method to assess student understanding

Students in this class will have four major essay assignments: a personal narrative, an ethnography/profile, an argumentative essay, and a final reflection essay. To prepare for these assignments, students will complete weekly discussion posts and responses. These different assignments require knowledge of purpose, context, genre, and audience. Students will need to tailor their writing and focus to the specific needs or purposes of the assignment/genre. They will also need to anticipate what evidence and support to include to meet audience expectations.

## \* Outcome #3: Method to assess student understanding

To prepare for each major essay, students will use graphic organizers and outlines to brainstorm focus, organize their ideas, and integrate evidence into their papers. They will also examine readings and identify models of logical structure and organization that they can use for their own writing. Students will also participate in peer review and one-on-one conferences with the instructor or tutors throughout the term to help improve logic and support in their rough drafts.

# \* 4. How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? Outcome #1:

Student work should reflect their understanding of reading and summarizing a work. They should also reflect thoughtfulness in picking and evaluating important quotations from the readings. Finally, in a short response, students should connect the elements of the reading to ideas for creating their own essays. If 80% of students' documents reflect their understanding of the form and content requirements for the SAR essays, then this outcome has been met.

## \* Outcome #2: How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome?

If 80% of students have a clear focus for each paper and can tailor writing and evidence to fit each assignment's audience and context, then this outcome has been met.
