Outcome #1: To assess this outcome I asked students to respond to the following question after reading about the inequities within the electoral process and watching 2 videos critiquing the electoral process.: "Do you believe that the electoral college should be abolished? Why or why not? If we continue with the electoral college, should the territories in the U.S. be able to participate in the electoral college? How do the inequities in voter participation as discussed in the reading and the inequities in the system impact what public officials hear?" The majority of the students who answered this question were able to adequately critique the electoral college with good arguments as to whether or not it should be abolished. They were also able to talk about how the inequities in the voter system impacted public officials. The students were able to apply sociological perspectives and see how social change has an impact on people, cultures and social institutions.

Outcome #2 - To assess this outcome I asked students to respond to the following questions after completing the readings on tuition hikes and student debt. "What can be done about the high cost of college tuition? Should the burden of a college education rest on the student or should the tax payers help foot more of the bill? Would you be willing to see your taxes increase so that more Americans could get a college education? What do you think of the solution in the TedTalk that suggested that tuition should be based on the projected income of one's major. In other words, should a person majoring in engineering pay higher tuition than a person majoring in theater?" The majority who answered the question were able to discuss the changes that have occurred in higher education particularly in reference to the high cost of tuition. They were also able to discuss possible social policy solutions that might address the problem. The average who achieved this outcome was lower because 4 students chose not to answer the question

Outcome #3 - To assess this outcome I asked students to respond to the following question: "At present, approximately 32 million Americans are without health insurance. After watching the film, which system do you think would work best for the United States? Why? What are the positives and negatives of the system that you think would work best. If you think the current U.S. system is best, state why you think it is the best with a list of the positives and negatives of the

current U.S. system. If you don't like any of the systems presented you can come up with your own idea. Be sure to discuss why you think your own idea would work well." The majority of the students who answered this question were able to understand how different health care systems impacted a country's ability to provide health care to their citizens. The results were lower than expected because 4 students chose not to answer the question as earlier.

* ANALYSIS 3. What contributed to student success and/or lack of success?

Outcome #1 - Students did well on this question. The percentage who successfully completed this question was greater than expected. The videos which explained the electoral college and the debate regarding the electoral college that they read helped them to articulate their position on this issue.

Outcome #2 & #3 had a lower percentage meeting this outcome simply because four students did not answer the discussion question. When students don't do the assignment they have difficulty meeting the outcomes. This tends to hold true in their other work.

I only had 3 students respond to the survey making it very difficult to address this question. Of the 3,1 individual felt his skills were developing. Another said they were proficient and a third said they were now an expert on the outcomes. This data doesn't really say much since it's such a small sample of students.

Yes, it did. Of those that answered the discussion questions, the majority meet the outcome. I always expect that students who don't participate in discussions will not do as well as those who do.

Answering the discussion questions is a good way for me to see if the students have a good understanding of the material. I can not figure this out as well for those who don't answer the questions. Perhaps adding a higher point value would encourage the students to engage more with the material.
