Outcome #1 Assessment was based on comparing a discussion question regarding how social location impacts the student's life at the beginning of the term with one at the end of the term.

* ANALYSIS 3. What contributed to student success and/or lack of success?

Outcome #1-I noticed that students had better responses for the discussion question regarding social location at the end of the term than what they had at the beginning of the term. Their responses were more thoughtful and in depth. I think that the readings, lectures and videos aided the students in their understanding of this concept.

Outcome #2 - The picture project is a good way to assess whether or not students understand social phenomena and can recognize it in their lives. Utilizing a visual and discussing how the concept is exemplified in the photo appears to be a very effective way of showing the student's understanding. I use visuals in my lectures and I believe this helps prepare the students for this project. Outcome #3 - For this outcome I use an essay question which requires students to define a concept and give an example from their lives which illustrates their understanding of the concept. The majority of the students were able to answer this question successfully. There were a couple of students who were not able to successfully answer the question which I think is due to not watching the video lectures where the concepts were discussed.

* 4. Helping students to realistically self-assess and reflect on their understanding and progress encourages students to take responsibility for their own learning. Please compare your students' perception of their end-of-term understanding/mastery of the three outcomes (found in student evaluations) to your assessment (above) of student achievement of the three outcomes.

For outcome #1, the students felt their ability to apply the sociological perspective to their everyday lives went from a weighted average of 2.2 (fair) to 3.8 (good). I feel that their perception was accurate, I found that students had a better understanding of how social location impacted their lives at the end of the term than at the beginning of the term. By the end of the term all students in the course could articulate the impact that social location had on their lives For outcome #2, the students felt their ability to identify and evaluate sociological phenomena went from a weighted average of 1.8 (poor) to 3.4 (good). It is difficult to know how accurate this is since only 5 students out of 20 responded to the survey. The majority of students did very well on the picture project. They were able to define their terms, use a visual that accurately exemplified the term they were discussing and have a robust discussion about the term from a sociological perspective. For outcome #3, The students felt their ability to apply the sociological perspective to their everyday lives went from a weighted average of 2.2 (fair) to 3.6 (good). Again, with only 5 students responding to the survey it is difficult to determine if their perception was accurate. I believe that most of the students in the course did a good job of applying the sociological perspective to their everyday life. This was evidenced in their ability to answer the essay question successfully

From my analysis, students are doing a good job of understanding the material presented in the course. I believe that the videos have been useful. I will continue to make improvements to my video lectures and also look for other readings that would aid in their understanding of the material.

Since my last assessment I reviewed and altered some of my video lectures to make them more concise. I believe that the shorter versions were easier for students to watch. All students who responded to the survey indicated that the videos were useful.

My course is an online course. Prior to each lesson the student is aware of the objectives for the lesson. I indicate which objectives will be met each time the student has a reading, watches a video, takes an assignment or does a project.

This particular discussion is one of the more interesting one's that students respond to.
