* Method of Assessment 3. What methods will be used to assess individual student understanding of each of these outcomes? (Please be specific.) Outcome #1: Method to assess student understanding

Students will brainstorm at least 3 ideas reflecting their own identity and then create abstract radial patterns using their own primary visual sources such as their own photos and drawings from direct observation.

* Outcome #2: Method to assess student understanding

Class critiques of finished works using unit vocabulary.

* Outcome #3: Method to assess student understanding

Written artist research for each project with guiding questions tied to drawing skill and communication of ideas. Class discussion where each student shares their findings. Finished works will be generated from the students' own ideas and will include oral and written explanation of their own concept and process.

* 4. How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome? Outcome #1:

Students' brainstorms for Patterns of Identity will show at least 3 different ideas. Personal photos shared as sources for abstraction. Final drawings show abstraction of primary sources. Students will share how visual image expresses personal identity in class critique and in writing on self evaluation forms. Students earning a 4-5 out of 5 on final project will have met this outcome.

* Outcome #2: How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome?

All students will participate in critiques of finished works. All students will describe their own work using unit vocabulary and will critique each other's work using unit vocabulary showing clear understanding of the vocabulary and its application to the work.

* Outcome #3: How will you know if you were successful in your efforts to teach this outcome?

Art historical references tied to each concept taught will be presented to students. Accurate and thoughtful artist research of a range of artists in sketchbook and class discussions. Ideas about own work shared in writing using self evaluation forms and orally in class critiques. Students earning a score of 4-5 out of 5 will have shown they have created work based on their own ideas while understanding the continuum of art created before them.
