March is Women's History Month in the US and March 11 is International Women's Day. Both nationally and internationally, there is much to be done to bring about gender equity across many areas. The official theme for this Women's Day is #embrace equity.

According to the US Census Bureau, "among full-time year-round workers, women earn approximately 18 to 20 percent less than men." The wage gap varies a lot by occupation: "while wages are at parity in some occupational sectors, gaps are as large as 45 percent in others." The difference increases also when broken down by race and ethnicity, with many women of color being paid even less. For example, Black women were paid 64%, and Hispanic women (of any race) were paid 57% of what white non-Hispanic men were paid, according to the US Bureau of Labor.



Women in each age group earn less than their male counterparts.


In postsecondary education in the US, there is still much work to be done. Although women now outnumber men in the U.S. college-educated labor force, the earnings gap persists. And as you might have theorized, during the pandemic, some gender disparities widened in the U.S. workforce.

Here are some tools you can use to find out more about gender disparities in pay:

What does this mean for us at the college? There is a lot to consider, including opportunities across the curriculum to reflect on these disparities. Reflection is good; it's better when it inspires action. In all of our dealings, inquiring about success rates, gendered pay differentials, and opportunities for advancement will give us more information to create better conditions for everyone at the college and after graduation.

Oregon Transfer Days returns to CGCC

Hey CGCC!

The annual "Oregon Transfer Days" college fair is coming in March. A poster and a social media image sized for Instagram & Facebook are attached. Feel free to share on your own social media. On Thursday, March 9, Columbia Gorge Community College will host Oregon Transfer Days 2023. Representatives from four-year colleges and universities will be on The Dalles Campus from 10 am to 1 pm in The Hook Cafe.

Oregon Transfer Days is an annual statewide tour of community colleges by university reps—one of the best ways for students to get a look at 4-year schools where they can finish their degree. Students and their families will meet with admissions representatives from around the state and beyond. CGCC students can start here, and go anywhere!

Over 15 institutions are slated to attend, with representatives showcasing what they have to offer for students who want to start at CGCC (or another Oregon community college) and transfer to complete a Bachelor's degree. Students get the chance to talk directly with transfer counselors and admissions officers, learn about options they may not know existed as well as what requirements they need to fulfill first. Information about admissions, financial aid, and degree programs will be available, and students and parents will have an opportunity to ask questions.

According to a recent survey by Lending Tree, students who start at a community college and transfer to a four-year institution to complete their degree save an average of 60% on tuition costs.



AARP Foundation Tax-Aide provides in-person and virtual tax assistance to anyone, free of charge, with a special focus on taxpayers who are over 50 or have low to moderate income. CGCC's Income Tax class students will be involved in the preparation process as IRS-certified preparers and other roles in the process.

Tax-Aide volunteers are located nationwide, and are trained and IRS-certified every year to make sure they know about and understand the latest changes and additions to the tax code. Several other Tax-Aide sites are open in the Gorge area. Tax-Aide was last located on the CGCC campus in 2011.

- <u>Complete Required Docs</u> = Check here to see if there's anything that requires more information. (Most
 if not all [forms should be web-based so you can fill them out on your computer or phone!)
- · Package Status = After review, this is where your award offer will be.





Tutoring and mentoring services are up and running! Check out cgc.edu/cove for the writing and math schedules, as well as instructions for what to do if you need help in another subject.



Info you need to create your GLOBAL account:


- · Apply for Financial Aid = Create profile
- . ISIR Status = Plug in the number of hours (credits) you're taking each term, see the Pell grant offered if applicable as well as loans. **Don't forget to ZERO out the loans at the bottom and recalculate if you don't want them. If you do, please reach out to Financial Aid to talk about options.**
- . Complete Required Docs = Check here to see if there's anything that requires more information. (Most if not all forms should be web-based so you can fill them out on your computer or phone!)
- . Package Status = After review, this is where your award offer will be.


